- offers a safe environment for people in disagreement to come together
- promotes dialog between the parties
- clears up misunderstandings and fosters new understandings
- helps parties find their own solutions

We partner with Law enforcement, the Court and Victims Services to provide **Restorative Justice services**. RJ is...

- is a different approach to dealing with crime and wrongdoing
- emphasizes repairing harms
- does not focus on punishment
- allows for greater accountability for those who have caused harm
- addresses harms and identifies needs of those who have been harmed

YCRC Statement –

Now more than ever people are looking for viable alternatives to the traditional criminal justice processes.
