### PROGRAMS

Via direct food distribution sites, home deliveries, and an 84 organization-strong nonprofit partner program, Yolo Food Bank provides poverty-reduction and food security for 45,000 Yolo County residents each month...and growing...as the COVID-19 socioeconomic crisis continues.

While Kids Farmers Market is on indefinite hiatus due to COVID-19 school closures, our four primary programs are:

- 1) Eat Well Yolo fresh food distributions: nearly 130 drive-through or walk-up distributions countywide each month.
- 2) Neighborhood Food Access, inclusive of Emergency Food Home Deliveries: for age 65+ or health-compromised individuals.
- 3) At-Risk Homeless Meal Deliveries: for homeless sheltered from virus spread in motel rooms by Yolo County jurisdictions.
- 4) Nonprofit Partner Organization no cost/low cost food access: serving food pantries, senior meal delivery programs, homeless and domestic violence shelters, migrant centers, college campuses, mental health and recovery programs, and more. Examples are STEAC, Davis Community Meals and Housing, Meals On Wheels – Yolo County, Empower Yolo, UC Davis/ASUCD Pantry, Fourth and Hope, Yolo Community Care Continuum, etc.
